Application and Registration

Online Application	March 11 – May 28
Course Registration	March 11 – May 28 first-come, first-served SNU students will join the course registration from May 13.
Tuition Payment Deadline	Until May 28
Virtual Exchange Registration	Early June

As the course registration will be executed on a first-come, first-served basis for the limited number of seats, we recommend international students to complete the online application by early May.

◆ Frequently Asked Questions



Eligibility

- ◆ Eligible are international students who are currently enrolled at overseas universities in an undergraduate or graduate degree program.

Immigration & Accommodation

- ◆ SNU does not provide on-campus housing and travel/immigration assistance for the 2021 Online ISP.

Grading & Credit Acquisition

- ◆ All courses are worth 3 credits and comprise of at least 45 lecture hours. Depending on the course, grades are awarded on an A to F scale or as pass/fail.
- ◆ Upon completion, an official academic transcript is issued. International students must check with their home university in advance whether the SNU Online ISP credits are acknowledged and can be transferred.

Application & Course Registration

- ◆ Go to <https://summer.snu.ac.kr> and fill in the online application form.
- ◆ Course registration is open to international students throughout the application period, but course registration for some courses may have a different registration schedule. Check our website for more information.

Classes & Virtual Exchange Activities

- ◆ All courses are managed through SNU's e-learning system that is accessible from all around the world.
- ◆ Virtual exchange activities include buddy matching and many other online events that involve diverse interactions.

For SNU students, course registration guidelines will be announced in early May.

2021 Online International Summer Program

This summer, the SNU ISP returns in a **FULLY-ONLINE** format to allow SNU and international students to learn together and mingle virtually.

1 All courses and activities are held online.

Classes are offered through SNU's e-learning classrooms that can be accessed by students from different locations.

2 Regular "major" courses are newly offered.

Along with 10 traditional ISP courses taught by SNU full-time faculty, 14 regular major courses that are normally part of SNU's regular curriculum are taught by renowned international scholars.

3 Virtual exchange activities are arranged for all students.

Buddy matching and other student events connect you with SNU students and other international students across the world.

4 Many scholarships for discounted tuition are available.

The SNU Online ISP offers various scholarships for a discounted tuition with free virtual exchange opportunities. Additional scholarships are available for students majoring in Korean/East Asian Studies.
